CompTIA PDI+ Printing and Document Imaging Certification

Are you teaching Electronics and Computer Service and Support? If so, you will be interested in the CompTIA PDI+ Certification. It is designed for entry level technicians working with printers, copiers, scanners, and multifunctional devices. If you are already teaching the A+, and also electronics, then it is an easy transition to the PDI+ certification. This certificate covers basic computer objectives as outlined for the A+ plus basic electronics. You can download the objectives and some sample test items from the CompTIA web site. DHTI+ Digital Home Technology Integration

Another new CompTIA certification is DHTI+ which covers skills required to incorporate home digital technologies with computer technologies.

The purpose of this certification is to verify a person has sufficient knowledge for installing and supporting most everything electronic in a home or office. Test objectives cover VOIP, security systems, audio and video wiring, basic networking, home satellite systems, telephone wiring and more. It is ideal for a student that has completed A+ training as well as Network+ and has some basic electronics. A little more study or experience installing telephone lines, security systems, and satellite systems will
